GCSE GRADES AND THE OTHER LEVEL 1/2 EQUIVALENT GRADES

- GCSE grades are: 1 to 9 [9 is the highest]
- A 'standard pass' grade = 4
- A 'strong pass' grade = 5
- There are other qualifications, such as BTECs & Cambridge Nationals, which are typical for vocational subjects (E.g. ICT/Health & Fitness/Child Development/Enterprise & Marketing], and these are graded at either Level 1 or Level 2 and use words such as: Pass, Merit, Distinction & Distinction* for their grading system, instead of 1-9.
- Level 1 means they are equivalent to GCSE grades 1/2/3
- Level 2 means they are equivalent to GCSE grades 4 and higher

FACTS:

Broadly, the same proportion of students will achieve a grade 7 and above as achieved a grade A and above.

Similarly, grade 4 and above will be roughly the same as achieved a grade C and above.

The top 20% (approx.) of students scoring a grade 7 or above, will be awarded a grade 9.

The bottom of grade 1 will be aligned with the bottom of grade G.

OLD & NEW GRADES

How the various grades compare to each other and with the old grading system



GRADES - HOPEFULLY EXPLAINED

- We now move to the various 'targets' students have.
- BEFORE moving on, we as a school need to stress that each pupil is an **individual**, with their own specific learning needs and learning styles, as well as individual talents.
- Sometimes, these targets do not suit some individuals, and so they
 may seem too harsh or too easy, but we need a generic approach
 that does suit the vast majority of our students.
- We want every student to do their very best and be proud of their qualifications/grades, no matter what they are.



STUDENT TARGETS – AND A SLIGHT CHANGE TO WHAT YOU ALREADY KNOW

- LAST YEAR, students were given 3 targets:
 - a **BRONZE** target
 - a **SILVER** target
 - a **GOLD** target
- For example: 3 / 4 / 5 or 6 / 7 / 8
- BUT, where do we get these targets from?
- Students take their KS2 SATs in Y6 at Primary School and they then achieve a Standardised Score, with 100 being average.



KS2 SAT SCORES -> ALPS BANDS

- Once we have their KS2 Score.
- This then places them in an ALPS Band from 1 to 10.
- ALPS is a national organisation which deals with data from KS2 to KS4 and then onto KS5.

ALPS BANDS → TARGETS

- These ALPS bands have been produced from what students should go on to achieve at GCSE in Y11, if they make expected progress from KS2 to KS4.
- These ALPS Bands then determine their Gold/Silver/Bronze Targets.
- These targets are for all subjects.
- There is an equivalent table for the Vocational Qualifications grades.

ALPS BANDS -> TARGETS FOR 2024



- For 2024 we as a school have decided to just go for ONE SINGLE TARGET for each student, so NO Bronze/Silver/Gold, to streamline & simplify this process.
- WHY? Both students and staff were seeing Bronze as 'good enough' and settling for this, but it is not. We want ALL STUDENTS to be aspirational, which I hope you also agree with?
- **SILVER** will be their New **Single** Target Grade which all students should be striving to achieve.
- This will be their TARGET GRADE for all subjects, from this year onwards. And we want all students to Strive for their Target Grade!

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
ALPS BANDS -> A SINGLE TARGET FOR 2024

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HOUSTON WE HAVE A PROBLEM!

- Now, that is all great IF we have the KS2 SAT scores, BUT ... due to the pandemic, Primary Schools did **not** sit KS2 SATs for our current Y10 & Y11 cohorts.
- So, ... what we did at LHS is used their CAT test data from Y7 to approximate the ALPS Band they should be in, which then drives their Targets.
- Obviously, this is not a perfect match, but it works reasonably well and is one way which was recommended to us and adopted by numerous schools.
- Because of this, Y10 & Y11 have an estimated Target, rather than an exact Target
- Y9 do have KS2 Scores, so all is good and they do have an exact Target.






- A students' average progress from KS2 to KS4 is measured by comparing the grades/scores they actually get with what they should be expected to get, based on their KS2 Scores.
- This generates an average Progress Score for each student.
- If their **Progress** Score is:
 - > 0 on average, they have made better progress than expected
 - = 0 on average, they have made the expected progress
 - < 0 on average, they have not made the expected progress</p>
- Y11 were told their current Progress Score [based on the End of Y10 Recording & their Predicted Grades, which was also on the EOY10 Report] at their Sharp Start Meeting with their Tutor at the start of term.

HOW CAN STUDENTS SUCCEED - 1?

- Listen to their teachers and act on their advice
- Know them and take ownership of their target
- Do classwork & homework to the best of their ability [there is always work to do at home]
- Upgrade their work [Purple pen]
- Work efficiently & effectively [stay off Social Media etc.]
- Prepare for tests / PPEs properly → what revision method works for them? We are all different. Variety!
- Try their very best and keep an open mind do not give up! I Can't yet!
- Work as hard as they can → see next slide





HOW CAN STUDENTS SUCCEED - 2?

- Get to lessons on time
- Have all the equipment (pen, pencil, ruler, calcs, highlighter ...)
- Be in school there is a direct correlation between fantastic attendance and great results, on average → Mr Coulson's slide!
- Grasp every opportunity offered intervention & revision sessions
- Ensure any CA/CWK is a good as possible → get those 'points in the bag'! Why wouldn't you want to maximise your CA/CWK score?
- Utilise key websites SENECA/GCSEPod/Corbettmaths/some subjects have their own websites (English, History, RE) and Satchel One.
- Start REVISION early making Summary Notes, Mindmaps,
 Flashcards, using PLCs, Exam Papers & Questions, ...

- An amazing amount of subjects / topics
- Short, quick recaps & reviews
- A different way to revise VARIETY!
- Watching & listening really works for some students
- Instant feedback
- Can be used on phones on the bus?
- Have they used it?
- Go on they should give it a try






- This is what 'success' is really about, and how to achieve it.

- For students in Y11 this is singularly the most important year. Making **'the most'** of their time in school, plus evenings, weekends, holidays over the course of this year, in a measured and sensible way, is key to success! There is still time to make a massive difference to GCSE grades.
